

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL SD-192.

An Act for the relief of Verna Wilson Ellis.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Verna Wilson Ellis, residing at the city of Toronto, in the province of Ontario, wife of Francis Joseph Ellis, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the town of Baie d'Urfe, in the province of Quebec, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the twenty-sixth day of September, A.D. 1959, at the said city, she then being Verna Wilson Harries; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
