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ns to take proper
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floors and other parts of the fabric of the church, and to take care that the church yard and burial ground are properly fenced and kept in order.

To see that the stipend of the Incumbent is properly collected and paid.

To provide fine white bread and wholesome wine for the Lord's Table.

To collect the alms of the congregation at the offertory, which alms are to be disposed of by the Incumbent and Churchwardens jointly, or, if they disagree, by the Bishop.

To see that the church and all things therein be in decent and orderly sort, and free from dust or anything unseemly.

To maintain order within the church during the times of divine service.

To present, at the visitation, all offences which may require the Bishop's notice.

To take charge of and look after the parsonage during the vacancy of a cure, and to insure the church and parsonage in insurance offices approved of by the Synod, and to produce policies and receipts for premiums at the visitation of the Bishop or his commissary.

To keep an account of all church goods and property, with additions as may, from time to time, be made to them, and to keep proper accounts of all funds of the Parish.

To make a statement of accounts and property at the annual Eastertide Vestry meeting, and to hand over to their successors in office any balance of cash, and all church property in their possession. All books of accounts shall be carefully preserved by them, and be open to inspection by any parishioner at any reasonable time.

Churchwardens and Committee shall continue in office until their successors are appointed.

Whether chosen by the Incumbent or Vestry, the duties of the Churchwardens shall be the same.

If any cure be vacant at the time fixed for the appointment or election of Churchwardens, one shall be appointed by the Bishop or his Commissary, and the other shall be chosen by the Vestry. The Churchwarden appointed by the Bishop shall remain in office until an Incumbent has been appointed to the cure, and has nominated a Churchwarden.

If the office of any Churchwarden or Sydesman chosen by the Vestry shall become vacant by death, resignation, removal, or otherwise, a meeting of the Vestry shall be called, as soon as conveniently may be, to elect a successor to the vacant office; and in like manner the Incumbent shall, at once, fill any vacancy so occurring in the office of the Churchwarden appointed by him.
