Now, Sir, I imagine that the Parts of this Passage distinguished by Italics, are those, against which, you except; otherwise you really forget to tell us what particularly gives you so much Offence. Let me see then, whether the Truth of this cannot be made out by the very Letters which you have quoted as authentic. In the first Letter, my Lord Albemarle writes to Lord Holdernesse, "In the Month of November I received a " Letter from three Persons, signing them-" felves John Patton, Luke Erwin, and Tho-" mas Bourke, representing to me that they " were Englishmen, who had been brought " to Rochelle, and put into Prison there, " from whence they wrote: having been " taken by the French Subjects, who feized " their Effects as they were trading with " the English, and other Indians, on the Ri-" ver Obio, and carried them Prisoners to " Quebec;
