

CARAQUET ISLAND, BAY DES CHALETTES.—Square tower on low dwelling. White.

MISCOU FOG WHISTLE.—A Steam Fog Whistle has been erected on Miscon Island, at the entrance of the Bay of Chaleur. This whistle sounded twice in each minute.

SHEDIAC BEACON LIGHTS.—Two lights on Point du Chene, at the Harbor of Shediac. Latitude 46d. 1m. 25s. N. Longitude 66d. 1m. 0s. W.

POINT ESCUMINAC LIGHT.—This lighthouse is situated in Miscon Bay. North latitude, 47d. 4m. 30s. West Longitude 66d. 4m. 30s. A fixed bright light, elevated 29 feet above high water. A dioptric lighting apparatus has been placed on this tower, which is visible for 25 miles.

BAY DE VIN ISLAND RANGE LIGHTS.—Two range lights are on the West end of Bay du Vin Island, Miramichi Bay, County of New Brunswick, N. B., to enable vessels seeking shelter to clear the point of shoal lying off the Island. The front light is fixed white catoptric light, 30 feet above high water mark, and should be visible in line of sight, 11 miles. Latitude N. 47d. 5m. 30s. Longitude W. 66d. 7m. 5s. The light is distant 1,122 feet easterly from the front one. It is also fixed catoptric, is elevated 42 feet above high water mark, and should be visible 11 miles. Both lights are hoisted on masts, with sheds painted red and bases; the front mast being 25 feet and the back one 39 feet above ground.

MISCOU ISLAND LIGHT.—This lighthouse is situated on Miscon Island, North latitude 48d. 1m. 0s. West longitude 66d. 5m. 45s. A fixed white light, elevated 79 feet above high water.

MIRAMICHI RIVER.—Lighthouse on Portage du Jan 1. Fixed white light, elevated 10 feet above high water.

Two beacon lights on Preston's Beach, about five miles above the Portage. Two beacon lights on Oak Point. Two beacon lights at Grand Lake. Fixed white lights. Visible 10 miles.

Lighthouse at Shippegan Gully has been removed from Taylor's Point on the southwest of Alexander's Point, on the northeast point of the entrance to the Gully. Latitude N. 45d. 42m. 35s. Longitude W. 66d. 25s. The light is a fixed white catoptric light, elevated 124 feet above high water, and should be visible 11 miles from a point seaward. The light consists as heretofore of a square wooden tower 50 feet high, painted to resemble a lantern, painted white. A small light, consisting of a glass hoisted on a pole, to show also a fixed white light, has been erected 484 feet S. W. by W. from the main light. It is elevated 22 feet above high water, and should be seen 9 miles in the direction of the range. The lights range with the buoy on the outside of the bar at the entrance to the Gully.

RIVER ST. JOHN LIGHTS.—Green Head, Sand Point, Belyand, Palmer's Landing, Oak Point, No Man's Friend, Oronto Shoals, West Bluff, Cox's Point, Robertson's Point, Langoy's Point, Grand Lake, Musquash Island, Hendry Farm, Washademoak Lake, Blackrock Point, and River, Grand Lake. Visible ten miles.
