

CARAQUET ISLAND, BAY DES CHALEURS. - Square tower on dwelling. White.

MISCOU FOG WHISTLE. A Steam Fog Whistle has been erected on Miscon Island, at the entrance of the Bay of Chaleur. The whistle sounded twice in each minute.

SHEDDIEAC BEACON LIGHTS. - Two lights on Point du Chene within the Harbor of Sheddieac. Latitude 46° 41m. 30s. N. - Longitude 63° 5m. 30s. W.

POINT ESCUMINAC LIGHT. - This lighthouse is situated in Miramichi Bay, North latitude, 47° 4m. 30s. West. Longitude 63° 5m. 30s. A fixed bright light, elevated 49 feet above high water. At this point a catoptric lighting apparatus has been placed on this tower, which is visible for 25 miles.

BAY DU VIN ISLAND RANGE LIGHTS. - Two range lights located on the West end of Bay du Vin Island, Miramichi Bay, County of No man's land, N. B., to enable vessels seeking shelter to clear the point of shoal lying off the Island. The front light is fixed white, catoptric, 30 feet above high water mark, and should be visible in line of sight one mile. Latitude N. 47° 5m. 30s. Longitude W. 63° 5m. 30s. The light is distant 1,122 feet easterly from the front one. This back light, catoptric, is elevated 42 feet above high water mark, and should be visible 11 miles. Both lights are hoisted on masts, with shrouds painted red, bases; the front mast being 35 feet and the back one 39 feet above ground.

MISCOU ISLAND LIGHT. - This lighthouse is situated on Birch Island, North latitude 48° 1m. 0s. West longitude 63° 30m. 30s. A fixed white light, elevated 79 feet above high water.

MIRAMICHI RIVER. - Lighthouse on Portage Island. Fixed white elevated - feet above high water.

Two beacon lights on Preston's Beach, about five miles above the river. Light. Two beacon lights on Oak Point. Two beacon lights on each Fixed white lights. Visible 10 miles.

Lighthouse at Shipperman Gully has been removed from Taylors Point on the southwest of Alexander's Point, on the northeast point of entrance to the Gully. Latitude N. 45° 43m. 30s. Longitude W. 63° 25s. The light is a fixed white catoptric light, elevated 133 feet above high water, and should be visible 11 miles from a height seaward. The light consists as heretofore of a square wooden lantern 20 feet high, glass to vane on lantern, painted white. A small light consisting of lantern hoisted on a pole, to show also a fixed white light, has been established 484 feet S. W. by W. from the main light. It is elevated 22 feet above high water, and should be seen 9 miles in the direction of the harbor. The lights range with the buoy on the outside of the bar at the entrance to Gully.

RIVER ST. JOHN LIGHTS. - Green Island, Bear Point, Belvedere, Palmer's Landing, Oak Point, No Man's Friend, Old moorish Head, York Bluff, Cox's Point, Robertson's Point, Lanjou's Point, Grand Lake, Musquash Island, Hendry Farm, Washademoak Lake, Blackerest Point, on the River, Grand Lake. Visible ten miles.

Third District from Point Leprechaun to North Head, Grand Manan, N. W., or North Channel, S. E., per foot draft of water, \$1.00.

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
