49. For the next greatest weight, same conditions, but on at least 1 arpent, 4

50. To the person who shall have reaped the greatest quantity and best quality of merchantable hops, fit for exportation, on at least one half arpent, 10

The hops are to be put into sacks containing at least 250 lbs. weight. Those who come into competition for the premium must give the committee suitable certificates, together with a specimen of 1 lb. weight, both of which must be handed to the Asst. Secretary on or before the 15th March.

51. For the next greatest quantity on the same conditions, 6

52. For the next ditto same conditions, 4

53. For the greatest quantity and best quality of clean Timothy Seed, clearly gathered, raised and saved in this District, not less than four bushels. 6

54. For clean Red Clover Seed, do. not less than 1 cwt. 6

55. For *Franc Foin* Seed raised and saved in this District, not less than 1 Cwt. 6

The following three prizes for Flax.

56. To the Farmer who shall sow with Flax the greatest quantity of land, not less than three arpents, in the year 1825, and shall at the proper season cause to be pulled, and immediately tied up in small bundles the produce, and set up in order to dry the seed, and when the seed is dry, to cause the same to be thrashed in order to save seed in good order, and then steep the flax in still water for a sufficient time, and then take it out and spread it to dry, and when dry, house it, and manufacture it into dressed flax,—and on producing to this Committee a certificate of the produce of each arpent of dressed Flax and Seed, with a sample of 1 lb. of dressed flax and one quart seed, the sum of 15

57. For the second greatest quantity of land not less than two arpents in a similar manner the sum of 10

58. For the third greatest quantity of land not less than one arpent, the sum of 5

N. B. If there should be more than one Competitor for any of the foregoing premiums, the greatest weight of dressed flax and seed, in the best order and of the best quality will be entitled to the premium.
