FOOD SCARCITY IN GOTHAM OWING TO VISITING CROWDS

Hotels and Restaurants Have Strained Time Trying to Feed Too Numerous Guests.

New York, Jan. 20.—More food has been eaten in New York City this week than during any other week in its history, and the great markets, with all their facilities, have been strained to supply the demand. This demand was for food of the best grades, for fresh provisions, for choice cuts, for selected stocks, for that quality sought by those who are able to pay for it. The city has well stocked markets enough, but the layer of cream is too thin to go around, particularly just now, when the demand is augmented by the daily presence of at least 200,000 strangers.
