MANY SCHOOL CHILDREN NOT IN GOOD HEALTH

Dr. Roberts Reports Deficiencies -Almost a Trolley Fatality.

HAMIL/TON, May 2.—(Special.)—Dr.

Roberts, the medical inspector of the public schools, made a report to the internal management committee of the board of education this evening that he had examined the children in all but four of the schools, and found that 1287 of them had defective teeth, 111 defective visions, 14 defective hearing, 3 defective speech, and 18 defec-tive general health. He recommended better ventiliation for the Victoria-avenue school. The trustees considered that his report justified his appointment. Efforts will be made to show the hospital governors that it is their duty to provide quarters for a dental infirmary for the looking after the school children's teeth. The dentists have volunteered to do the work. An eight-room addition will be made to the Sophia-street school next year to be used for the teachers in training with the Normal school. Copies of the booklet containing the history of Central school will be sent to all the ex-pupils who registered at the celebration of the semi-centennial of the school. Prof. Johnston reported on the effects of the change from teaching music by the tonic-sol-fa to the staff notation.
