

DEATH OF MR. JAMES CRAWFORD.

He Was the Oldest Orangeman in Toronto
and Father of Mr. Thomas Craw-
ford.

A large circle of friends will learn
with regret of the death of Mr. George
Crawford, father of Mr. Thomas Craw-
ford, ex-warden and ex-M.L.A. for
West Toronto. Deceased, who died
early yesterday morning at his resi-
dence, 99 Givens-street, was one of the
best known men in the cattle trade.

He was born at Inniskillen, County
Fermanagh, Ireland, 84 years ago. He
came to Toronto in 1855 and has re-
sided here since. He was probably the
oldest Orangeman in the city, having
joined the order above 60 years ago.
He was locally connected with L.O.L.
No. 4, and his was the familiar figure, in
all 12th of July processions. In politics
he was a staunch Conservative, and
was a member of St. Philip's Epis-
copal Church.

Mr. Crawford leaves a widow (who is
very seriously ill) one son and three
daughters. The funeral will take place
on Monday under Orange auspices.

NEW CIVIC BUILDINGS.

Discussion Whether Architect Lennox
Should Superintend the Furnishing
and Laying out of Grounds.

The sub-committee of the Finance and
Property Committee met yesterday after-
noon to consider Architect Lennox's
report in answer to the committee's inquiries
as to the probable time and cost required
to finish the new city buildings.

There were present Ald. Lamb (chairman),
Sheppard, Dunn, Denison, McMurich, Bow-
man and Denison.
Architect Lennox objected to the architect
furnishing the building or sodding the
grounds. He proposed that the architect
should be responsible to the committee for
the laying out of the grounds, he said that
Architect Lennox was not capable of do-
ing that.

He said Ald. Dunn rose and told Ald. Deni-
son that he had read the architect's report
towards Mr. Lennox, and called upon him to
back his statement. He remarked that
Ald. Denison was not any more a repre-
sentative of the people than the rest
of them nor any more anxious to save
ratepayers' money.

Ald. Denison thought the Commissioner
should see the grounds, and the committee,
with the aid of officials, look after the fur-
nishing, and so see the architect's commis-
sion on the work.

Ald. McMurich asked with this:
After much talk a non-committal motion
was carried by which the committee re-
solved not to endorse any of the estimates,
and reserving the right to employ the ar-
chitect or not as they may see fit in the
mishling sodding, etc. was passed unan-
imously.

A motion was passed recommending that
the Property Committee look after the fur-
nishing and make the recommendations
through the Board of Control.

ROWDY ELEMENT IN CONTROL

Lawless Conditions Exist at Dyea and
Skaguay Just Now.

Letter from Governor Brady of Alaska to
the Washington Authorities—Gamblers,
Thugs and Lewd Women in the Ascend-
ant and are Carrying Out Their Will
With a High Hand.

Washington, Feb. 18.—Secretary Bliss
is in receipt of a letter from Governor
John G. Brady of Alaska, descriptive
of the lawless condition of affairs at
Skaguay and Dyea. It was referred to
at the Cabinet meeting to-day, when
Alaskan affairs were under discussion,
and was considered sufficient justifica-
tion by the members for the despatch
of additional military force already au-
thorized to be sent to Alaskan terri-
tory. The following is a copy of the
letter:

"News from Skaguay by the steam-
boat now in port is serious. The United
States deputy marshal has been shot
dead in the discharge of his duty. An-
other man was killed at the same time
at the same place. Recently the steamers
have been carrying great lists of pas-
sengers. Many of these are gam-
blers, thugs and lewd women, from the
quartars of the cities from the coast.
They have taken in the situation at
Skaguay and Dyea, and appear to be
carrying out their will with a high hand.
The best people at these places are powerless, because they have
no municipal form of government. The
United States Marshal is powerless, be-
cause he can appoint only a few de-
puties, and he does not know their names
they are singled out as targets by this
rough element."

GROSS MUST GO BACK.
Court of Appeal Decide That He is Charged
With Offence for Which He May
be Extradited.

The Court of Appeal has dismissed
the appeal in re Gross, and affirmed the
order of Justice Ross, remanding the
prisoner, William Gross, for extradi-
tion to Allentown, Penn., U.S.A., where
he is to be tried for the larceny of some
diamond rings. Counsel for the prisoner
contended that larceny had been abolished
by the Criminal Code and that the
evidence with several witnesses, who the
Court held that the evidence showed
that the prisoner had been guilty of an
offence recognized throughout Canada,
and the States as theft or larceny at
common law, and that he was guilty of
it under the Criminal Code, and that he
should be extradited under the Extradition
treaty, by whatever name such offence might
be technically known.
