## Woman's World...

Devoted Specially to the Interests of our Women Readers.

It is a pleasure to hear that "party frocks are almost as necessary an adjunct to the little girl's wardrobe in this progressive age as they are to the grown-up sister." The woman who can gravely make such a statement as that speaks as "one of the foolish women." If there is one thing which belongs by right to a child, it is its childhood, and how can it have this priceless gift if it is to be dressed and trotted about to infantile dances and parties, and paired off to dance with little boys, just as "grown-ups" are. And to be tricked out in fashionable skirts of silk and chiffon, with lace arms and necks and high-heeled shoes, gotten up regardless of sense and cost to resemble little fashion-plates, and to pose and strut and gossip and flirt—could there be any more ruinous bringing up for a little girl? No wonder they are feather-headed and silly and prone to be the victims of their teens. Their mothers may think it is "cute" and "sweet," and "sweety pretty" and a dozen other gushing things to get up their little girls and boys in this style, and permit them to gab about to dances and children's parties, but it is nevertheless a robbery of the innocence and beauty of childhood—such functions and such parade of dress rob any child of its freshness and guilelessness, and convert it into a little man or woman of the world before it has outgrown its baby days. The more a child is kept as a child, the more simply it is fed and dressed, the brighter, the greater will its capacity be for enjoyment later on the fresher and more vivid will be its impressions, the better will be its physical and mental health and the clearer its sense of right and wrong. One marvels at the lack of the sense of responsibility which so many women display in this matter of children's parties and dances.

There is always something new in the shops to beguile the feminine mind and to draw forth her dreams. The latest thing which seems to be designed to replace the old and inadequate silk handkerchief, which was worn round the neck under the coat, to preserve the collar and to supply becoming warmth at the same time, it is a long, wide silk scarf, with fringed ends, which not only passes round the neck but falls the full length of the coat in front, and makes a pretty bit of color when the coat is thrown open. A nice one may be had for \$2.50, but the beauties in rich colors and broadness run much higher in price. Some of the Oriental effects are seen, some come in plain solid colors, while others have various designs and figures to suit all fancies. To feel one of these soft silk scarves about the neck and to note the charming effect on the opening of the coat, seems to be sufficient excuse for investing in one.

There is a passage in "The Life of Sir John A. Macdonald," which has just been published, which will account for the fall men and women which Du Maurier loved to draw in his pictures of London society life. When a giant of either sex appeared in London, he would spend all his pocket money in seeing the monster and trying to get a glimpse of him, and more than once he hinted that if he could have been the real "Gulliver" his happiness would be complete.

A Kingston correspondent writes me as follows: I hope that you will prove one of our allies in a movement to put domestic science on a scientific basis. The ideal of a domestic science course is to place everything relating to the house on the basis of scientific knowledge instead of mere experience and instinct. To demand trained services for woman's work, whether it be as housekeeper or servant, means to give added dignity and respect to woman's work; to reclaim it from the ranks of unskilled labor to the position of trained and skilled service will gain all the power and respect for that similar movements have done for untrained labor in other lines. The importance of domestic science from simply industrial and economic standpoints is rivalled by the importance of the gain to the woman worker. She will command respect for her ability. It has long been our cry that woman's work was judged not on its merits, but as woman's work, and it will continue to be so until housework, which occupies so large a portion of women's time, is performed in such a way that it is capable of being judged as work and not a certain individual's work.

This long preamble is written in the hope of interesting you and capturing your support in giving publicity to the movement for domestic science. The American women have been working for years to place house-making on a scientific basis; and to their college scientific training they have added years of practical experience. It is a question in my own mind whether we shall ever get beyond popular cooking with a slight mixture of theory until our college women are prepared to study the subject as scientifically as they now do mathematics. But, in order to hasten that time we want to have a course of lectures given by women trained on the scientific aspect of home-making. There is a meeting called for Friday, Dec. 15, in the Normal School, at which addresses will be delivered by Mrs. Hootches of Hamilton, the Minister of Education, and others, with the hope of interesting college women, teachers and thoughtful women generally in the necessity for more exact ideas of domestic science, and with the hope of gaining their co-operation in having the lectures given.

The regular monthly meeting of the Women's Canadian Historical Society will be held in the society's room, Educational Building, on Thursday, at 8 p.m. The first of a series of papers on Canadian History will be read by Miss Fitzgibbon. Her subject will be "War of the Conquest Subsequent to the Fall of Quebec." Miss Constance Boulton will also read a paper on "Sir William Johnson at Niagara."

**CRAWFORD AND McEACHREN.**  
 High School Board Decide to Give Them Six Months' Leave of Absence.  
 The past, present and the future of Jarvis-street Collegiate Institute formed the principal business last night at the meeting of the High School Board. Of all the large number of trustees present, not one but thought something in regard to the efficiency of the teaching staff ought to be done, but the board's intention was that they should be dismissed and how it should be done. Some thought the board should be guided by the inspector, who had shown a weakness in the school in classics and science, while others thought the principal and Mr. Manley's own weakness was the cause of the trouble. The board was divided, with along with those of the classical and science masters.

It was finally decided to give Messrs. Crawford and McEACHREN six months' leave of absence, commencing on Jan. 1, 1900, in lieu of notice of dismissal. This disposition with their services at the end of next June. The report of Inspector Seath showed the weakness in the school to be in science and classics. On the call for motions, one from Dr. Elliott came first, and read as follows:

Owing to the fact that a widespread belief has existed for some years in Jarvis-street Collegiate Institute that the staff of this school is inefficient, and also on account of the report of a sub-committee of the school management committee, which investigated the complaints against the school, I beg leave to give notice that at the next meeting of the board I shall move, that the staff of Jarvis-street Collegiate Institute be asked to tender their resignations, and that on or after a date to be named by the board a reduction of the staff by one or more teachers.

This was followed by a resolution from James Wilson, seconded by a resolution from W. G. Crawford and N. McEACHREN, that the staff of Jarvis-street Collegiate Institute be asked to tender their resignations, and that on or after a date to be named by the board a reduction of the staff by one or more teachers.

Mr. Fraser moved that Mr. Manley's name should be added to the other two, as he had been the cause of all the trouble at Jarvis-street, because of his ambition to oust and succeed Principal MacMurchy. The attack on Mr. Manley did not meet with approval. Trustee Leslie asked Mr. Fraser why he wanted the others to be dismissed if Manley was the cause of all the trouble. Trustee Fraser's motion did not get a second.

Wilson, Leslie, Clarke, G. Wilson, Ferguson and Mrs. O'Connor while the night was over. Trustees Church, McCollum, Elliott, Schoff and Fraser.

## GOSSIP ABOUT MANITOBA.

Mr. Charles Marcell Writes Le Soleil That the Campaign is a Very Bitter One.

Laurier is Keeping Out of It

And the Conservatives From the Federal Parliament are Working Night and Day.

Montreal, Dec. 5.—(Special)—Le Soleil, the Quebec Liberal organ, publishes the following despatch from Winnipeg, said to have been sent by Mr. Charles Marcell, who is sporting in the Prairie Province in Premier Greenway's interest. "Never," he says, "has a political campaign been carried on here with so much bitterness, and one may say that the entire Conservative party of the Dominion has concentrated its forces here. Four former ministers have meetings night and day, while the Federal Government is neutral. Hon. Mr. Patterson and Mr. Fraser, who held meetings here in the fall, have returned to the east. The latter Government has adopted the policy of non-intervention in provincial campaigns. This is what Sir Wilfrid did during the recent Ontario general election; for, although he spoke once in Ottawa, he did it simply as an elector. Neither did he take part in the Quebec local elections. What will be the result here on Thursday? I think the Government will be victorious. Although I cannot but be impressed by the confident air of the Conservatives, there are 40 counties and the Conservatives pretend to be absolutely certain of carrying 27.

A Talk With Hewitt Bostock, M.P.

Has Got Promise of a More Direct Mail Route for His Constituents.

Hewitt Bostock, M.P., the polished Cambridge University man who represents Victoria, B. C., in the Commons, has been a frequent visitor at Postmaster-General Macleod's house the past few days. As a result, he goes back to British Columbia with the promise of the improved mail service they are to get.

A More Direct Route. Late in the stage which carried the daily mails into the Boundary Creek district, the communication with the outside world will now be conducted by means of the Columbia and Western Railroad, and the letters and papers that used to go via the tortuous path round by Rossland will be quickly sent the more direct route by Rossland.


