Sub-Committee Has Been Awakened and a Meeting Has Been Held.

WILL VISIT MARKET AT 7 O'CLOCK

On Thursday Morning-What Assess ment Commissioner Fleming Thinks City Should Do.

The revival of the Cattle Market prob-

lem has had the effect of bringing together ago. Ald, Sheppard, Woods, Burns and Urquhart, who are part of the committee met yesterday at the City Hall. Ald Hubbard and Fraleigh and City Commissioner Coatsworth were also at the meeting. Ald. Burns suggested improvements, which included the removal of the market to the Garrison Commons, at a cost of from \$75,-000 to \$100,000, or else to add to the Cattle Market that portion of Stanley Park south of King-street. The market must be brought into modern shape, and Ald. Burns thought that \$50,000 at least should be raised by bylaw for that purpose this year. Ald. Sheppard remarked upon the filthy condition of the market at present, and Ald. Woods suggested a subway to connec the market with the Annex.

The committee decided to visit the market on Thursday morning at 7 o'clock and discuss the situation with cattlemen and representatives of the railways. The World asked Assessment Commissioner Freming what he thought of the Cattle Market matter, and he replied that the city will have to arrange with the Dominion government to purcaase the Garrison Common, which includes the lands lying east of the Exhibition grounds, between the roadway leading in from Strachan-avenue to the water. This land is of no particular value for anything but the market. Both railways are within easy access, and Mr. Fleming's suggestion is that the old Cattle Market be practically closed up and the site sold for factory purposes, but the Annex, which is south of the tracks, and is larger than the main market, be retained. This Annex is on land adjoining the Garrison Common. The Commissioner urges the caim that the city should have something that would be permanent, and would be useful even if the most sanguine anticipations of growth of the Cattle Market business were realized. The Garrison Common has an area of about 100 acres, and its position is such that it is eminently suited for a cattle market. He does not like the Stanley Park suggestion.
