

The system in Canada, introduced in 1917 was having a rapid growth. Five of the nine provinces had accepted the principles, Manitoba, Saskotchewan and British Columbia had set up single wage boards for themselves, women forming portions of the board.

In the majority of cases in Manitoba, the minimum wage for girls was ten dolars a week and for women twelve dollars. British Columbia was adopting an even higher rate.
