HIGH SCHOOL GIRLS TO STUDY CONDITIONS IN LOCAL FACTORIES

"Proper Dress" Subject of Talk at Supper Meeting Last Night.

A most interesting meeting of the High School Girls' Club took place on Thursday night after the commencement exercises, when the girls met for supper in the Y. M. C. A. Building. The principal speaker for the occasion was Miss Hardcastle, manager of the employment bureau at the Sonerville box factory. She spoke chiefly about her work and opened up many new fields for thought on the labor question. This talk was the introductory to a visit by the club to various industrial institutions in the city. The club discussion groups have undertaken to invite a speaker from a certain local institution, then afterwards visit that institution or others similar to it, and then hold a final meeting, at which they will discuss what they have learned during the visit.

Another speaker at the meeting was Miss Doris Selles, who spoke on "Proper Dress for the Schoolgirl." She did not advise a uniform costume, but urged that in choosing their clothing and dressing their hair the girls should consider service and suitability to the occasion.

Miss Marion Grant, the president, was in the chair. The program included recitations by Miss Ruth Tanner and Miss Ruth Johnston.

CHINESE ENTERTAIN THEIR TEACHERS AT TEA IN CLUB ROOMS

Ministers Also Guests At Most Enjoyable Affair.

Reports are often published of tea-meetings but seldom of a Chinese tea-meeting, but one was held yesterday in the Chinese Christian Association rooms.
