AN ORDINATION

Rev. H. J. Fenton Will Go to Kimball—City Happenings. HAMILTON, June 25.—(Special.)—Herbert Jefferson Fenton was ordained as a minister this evening in the Barton-street Methodist Church by Rev. W. J. Smith, president of the Hamilton Conference. He will be stationed at Kimball.

Charles Friedrich Schwarz, a cigar manufacturer for many years, died today at the residence of his son-in-law, H. B. Whipple, 26 Northwest-avenue. Selby Smith of Smith & Whipple was arrested to-day charged with attempting to defraud the Star Manufacturing Co., Toronto. The company has also issued a writ to recover \$246 from the firm.

Morris Moore was arrested to-day on the charge of trespassing on the Jockey Club. Louis Hughes, the jockey who was injured in the steeplechase to-day, was taken to the city hospital in rather bad shape. His nose was broken, several teeth were knocked out and he was seriously bruised about the body.

Bravities. Although the city council two weeks ago requested the Ontario Government to say whether it would pay the increase if the city doubled the Minrade jurors' fees, no response has been received.

Louis Frank, accused of conspiring to defraud the Hamilton Steel and Iron Company in the sale of some scrap, gave himself up and was manacled until Tuesday under bail of \$2,000.



FAILED TO MAKE GOOD

Defendants Claim Sweeney Was to Fix Ontario Government.

Before Justice Teetzel, in the non-jury assizes, Geo. R. Sweeney, a Toronto barrister, is suing H. J. F. Sison, a solicitor of Fort Frances, and Louis Christie, a butcher and lumberman of Rainy River. He asks the court to declare that he is entitled to a half interest in the pine timber on his own property amounting to 17 grants in Paragton Township. He purchased several veterans' claims, upon which the government reserved the right to cut pine timber. Defendants wanted the pine, and as Sweeney, it is alleged, assured them he could "fix" the government to honor their claims, they gave him \$1000. Sweeney's tender was not accepted. So the defendants bought the successful tenderer's right independently of Sweeney. Christie has a contract to supply \$40,000 worth of railroad ties to Mackenzie and Mann and had to have the timber, but as Sweeney had failed to make good with the government they didn't see any further use for him. They have put in a counter claim for \$1545, including the sum that is alleged to have been applied toward "fixing" the government and which was not paid, as well as traveling and sundry expenses, which they advanced to plaintiff.
