AUST BE NO CHANGES IN CORONATION DATH

Rev. John Coburn's Address to the Orangemen of the West District of Toronto Yesterday.

"Liberty is one of the most precious things men enjoy, and I want to talk to you about our civil liberty, our intellectual liberty, our religious liberty and our spiritual liberty. The Church of Rome is the foe of them all, and it is our duty to stand fast and defend

all these forms of liberty."

Such were the introductory remarks of Rev. John Coburn, grand chaplain of Ontario West, at the annual service the western district L.O.L., yester in St. Andrew's Hall. Tracing the growth of civil liberty from the time the Israelites were led

out of the land of bondage, down to the present, he said that the one clause in the British constitution which made British people free was that which insists that the man who sits upon the throne must be a Protestant.
"We must insist," he said, "that there shall be no doubt as to the re-


ligious belief of the man who occupies the throne. If they want us to abandon the oath taken by the King, let them large abandon the foolish and silly old claim way. of the Pope of Rome. When we want a priest of Rome to rule over the British Empire, we will make him king. When the Pope ceases to be the universal 'papa' then we Orangemen will be ready to abandon the coronation oath, and when Rome does that, she will be no longer Rome."
