Buffalo, Oct. 20.—A prominent member of the Hot Stove League, who was all season pretty well acquainted with Manager Pat Donovan of the Buffalo Bisons, declares that statements to the effect that Pat Donovan will manage the Boston Red Sox next year, if Lannin still owns the team, are away off the track and running wild in the woods.

"Pat Donovan told me and other well-known baseball fans this season, and often repeated the remark that he would like to stay in Buffalo, and that under no

circumstances would he ever take the managerial reins of a major league club again," he said. "I'm thru with that class.
