HUN FRIGHTFULNESS EXTENDS TO SPAIN

Germans Have Supplied Half Mil-lion to Induce Wrecking of Enter-prises Connected With or Owned by the Allies

New York, Dec. 14—A London cable to The World says: El Radical, a promi-nent Spanish newspaper, says that ex-tensive German plots to destroy railway lines, bridges and tunnels in the prov-ince of Huelva (a coal-mining district) north of Cadix, and close to the Portu-guese frontier, have just come to light, the scheme being to wreck enterprises for the purpose of sabotaging the Barcelona line, which is the headquar-ters of the plot, which in its ramifications has been traced to the German legation recently unmasked in the United States.

The German purpose is said to be to frustrate the export of copper from the famous Rio Tinto mine to the Allies' countries. Since the command of the sea passed to the Allies, the Rio Tinto mine has been the scene of unusual activity.
