Exchange of Ideas Seen Greatest Good Of Imperial Parley Legal Committee Under Mr

Lapointe Struggles With Locarno Treaty BY HERBERT BAILEY

British United Press ONDON, Nov. 10-The legal committee of the Imperial Conference, headed by Hon. Ernest Lapointe, is still struggling with the Locarno treaties, trying to draft a memorandum on the subject for future guidance in such cases, but apparently has made little real progress because of the delicacy of the problem and the failure among the delegates to agree upon the exact wording of the memorandum.

MORE CAREFUL.

It can be taken for granted, however, that as a result of the delegates' deliberations the British Government will be far more circumspect in signing any future treaty like Locarno, although they feel that the result of getting Germany into the League justifies the treaty entirely.

While much optimism is being expressed over the results of the conference in some quarters, those in closest touch with the situation declare that the conference will produce little more than pipus reso-lutions and the most valuable result will be an interchange of ideas among the various members of the Dominions and with members of

the British Government. JUSTIFIES SELF.

The conference justifies itself, it is said, because it enables the Dominion premiers to bring themselves in touch with Empire affairs, which is impossible without personal contact.
