New Brunswick Supplies Demand in Parts of United States

For several weeks carloads of Christmas trees have passed through the city bound for the larger American city bound for the larger American city markets. The trees have been secured in almost every part of the province, but the St. John River district probably contributed more than any other section of the country. The shipments through St. John have not been as heavy as through McAdam, which was the junction point for all shipments from Edmundston and intervening points.

From some of the smaller country places along this line as many as 18 cars of Christmas trees have been shipped to Pennsylvania. On examining the shipments it is found that the trees are tied in bundles of two, three and sometimes more, with binder twine, while the whole mass was secured by several strands of wire, run over the top and secured under the car.


It is estimated that each car contained from 600 to 700 trees. Thus from one village alone more than 11,000 trees were shipped.




