

PICKNICKERS SEE CANOEISTS DROWN

World War Veterans Victims of Accident When Craft Upsets.

Boston, May 11.—With scores of picknickers powerless to aid because of the high ledges on either side of the Charles river, two young men were swept to their death in the rapids of Hemlock Gorge, Newton Upper Falls. The accident happened as the youths in common with hundreds of other persons, were taking advantage of the fine weather to make the first canoe trip of the season. The frail craft in which the two men were paddling was caught in the current above the dam of the N. E. Spun Silk Corporation, and both were thrown out.

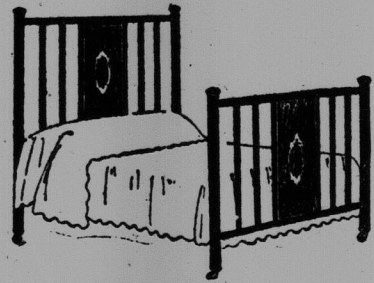
One body was recovered a little later. It was that of Carl L. Kraut, twenty-five, of 39 Prince street, Jamaica Plain. He sank almost immediately and the body, drifting to still water, was not carried over the dam.

The other youth was Bernard N. Landin, twenty-seven, of 72 Bay street, Jamaica Plain. He was able to keep himself afloat, and was carried down stream at a dizzy rate a few feet behind the canoe. He was carried over the dam.

Both youths were prominent in Jamaica Plain. Both were members of the Masons. Kraut was scoutmaster of troop 6, and Landin was assistant scoutmaster. They were chums and were invariably seen in the company of each other. Both were veterans of the World War.

RECENT DEATHS

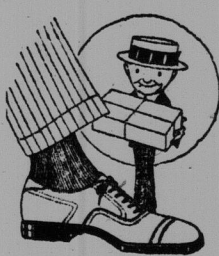

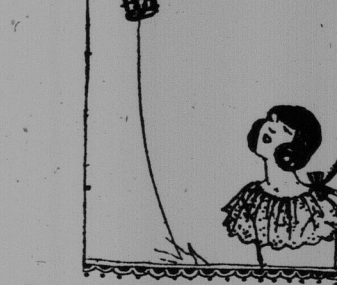
