Mrs. William Avery.
The death of Mrs. William Avery, aged sixty-seven years, occurred Monday at her home in Chatham. She is survived by her husband, four daughters, one of whom is Mrs. Alexander Gouche, of St. John, three sons and one sister. The funeral was held yesterday morning and interment made in St. Michael's cemetery.

Captain George F. Corning.
The death is announced in Lynn, Mass., of Captain George F. Corning, well-known in St. John and Yarmouth as commander of square riggers, including the ship Novatia and ship Vendome. He was born at Beaver River, Yarmouth county. On two occasions Captain Corning had thrilling experiences when ships which he commanded were burned at sea. The first was the Novatia, from Shields for San Francisco. The ship was abandoned and Captain Corning and his men were three days adrift in open boats before they were picked up by a German vessel. The second disaster befell the ship Vendome, from New York for Amsterdam. On this occasion Captain Corning and his crew were rescued by the St. John bark Stillwater.

The death occurred at Geary Monday night of Charles Carr, aged fifty-three years. He is survived by his widow, six sons, Clarence, David, Frederick, Louis, Elbridge and Archie; five daughters, Mrs. Annie Miller of Geary; Thelma, Isabelle, Loretta and Margaret, at home; two sisters, Mrs. Jane Till and Mrs. Rebecca O'Brien, and one brother, Reuben Carr, all of Geary.

ZEAL OF FAITHFUL WATCHDOG SENDS MASTER TO HIS DEATH
New York, Feb. 16—How a dog, in his zeal to save his master, succeeded only in sending him to his death early this morning, is the story told on the waterfront here today by bargemen. The barge Rose was anchored in the Morris Canal Basin, Jersey City. Sailors sleeping on other barges moored nearby were awakened by the frantic barking of the Great Dane owned by Gus Johnson, the captain. The police were called, and searchlights from a patrolboat were thrown on the scene, revealing Johnson struggling in the water. Patrolman Frank Monahan started down the gangplank of the Rose, but was driven back by the Great Dane, which had temporarily forgotten the plight of its master in the performance of its duties of a watchdog. After making several attempts, the police succeeded in beating the dog into submission. Then the boarded the barge, but too late. Johnson had drowned.

Hairs Will Vanish After this Treatment
