Appeal For Clothing From British Relief Association in New York

The British War Relief Association, Inc., headquarters, British Imperial Club, 108 East 90th street, New York City, has issued the following appeal—

Editor Times:

Sir—The enclosed appeal signed by Dr. Shipley, Master of Christ College, Cambridge University, England, has been received by the president of Princeton University.

"Do you think you could collect from the Princeton men and their friends any old clothes? It is difficult for those far away to appreciate what is going on in England. We have practically half a nation on our hands and ninety per cent of them are absolutely destitute; they have no money and no belongings of any kind. Our great base hospital on the banks of the River Sever now holds 800 and next week will hold 1,000 wounded. A hundred Belgian wounded came in yesterday."

"If you could issue a rousing appeal and send some clothing as quickly as possible—any sort of clothing and underclothing, suits, overcoats, hats, caps, boots, slippers, handkerchiefs, sleeping garments—we should be eternally thankful. Practically everything is needed except ball dresses."

You will see that he says, "practically half a nation is on our hands, and that ninety per cent of them are absolutely destitute."

The British War Relief Association has arranged to forward all clothing and supplies direct to Doctor Shipley as fast as they are received.

Will you not help these suffering men, women and children by making known their urgent and desperate need to your readers and asking them to send contributions of clothing or money to the headquarters of the association, 108 East 90th Street, New York City.

We have already sent twenty-four large cases of clothing and medical supplies to Great Britain, but much more is needed to meet this terrible distress. Trusting that you will do all in your power to give this appeal the publicity it deserves and thanking you in advance, Yours truly,
