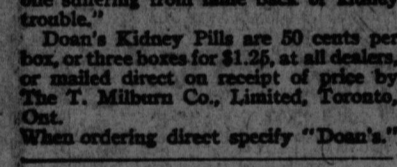

MUCH COAL BANKED

Probably 400,000 Tons in Cape Breton By Spring. (Gloucester Bay Gazette)

The Dominion Coal Co. have so far this winter banked a very large quantity of coal at their several banking stations, and at present the amount of black diamonds placed upon the ground for spring shipments is considerably in excess of this time last year.

To date no less than 240,000 tons have been banked and there are still about two months before navigation opens in which banking will be continued. The large bank at the central banking station No. 7, of which the company has 100,000 tons, is particularly noteworthy. It is a large, rectangular colliery has banked 20,000 tons, or just half its capacity. The Steel Co. Waterford collieries there are banks containing 40,000 tons. The Steel Co. has so far banked about 20,000 tons.

Unless there is a very early opening of navigation, the company will have about 400,000 tons or more in their various banks in the spring.

A WOMAN'S VIEW OF WOMAN SUFFRAGE

Mrs. Stanley McCormick, in her address at the National Suffrage Convention in Louisville, said, in substance:

"So much attention has been given to the growth and development of the cause of woman's suffrage that the effect of the franchise work on the women themselves has been lost sight of, or has been little considered. But today it is becoming clear that the cause of suffrage is more valuable to the individual woman than she is to the cause. The reason is that this movement has the greatest though silent force of evolution behind it, being impelled slowly forward, whereas the individual is largely dependent for her development on her powers of perception and sympathy, and especially on those expressions of life which she brings herself into contact. Now, the woman suffrage movement offers the broadest field for contact with life. To offer, first and foremost, co-operation of the most effective kind with others; it offers responsibility in the life of the community and the nation; it offers opportunity for the most varied and far-reaching service. To come into contact with his suffrage movement means, to some individuals, to come into a larger world of thought and action than they had known before. To others it means approaching the same world in a more real and effective way. To all it gives a wider horizon in the recognition of one fact—that the broadest human aims and the highest human ideals are an integral part of the lives of women."

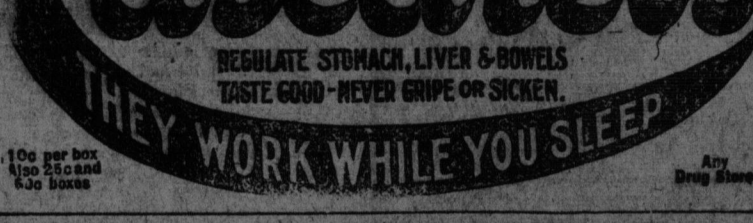

Vienna, Nov. 1—Eight persons, including a farmer, his family, and three boatmen are in danger of starvation on a small island in the Danube, opposite Fala, in Hungary, which is cut off from the mainland by drifting ice. IN PARLIAMENT

Ottawa, Feb. 29—The opposition hurled one last effective bolt at the government as the long-discussed and amended grain bill got its third reading in parliament today. W. E. Knowles, of Moosejaw, denounced the measure, while the Liberal benches cheered the thrust.

As an alternative to government ownership of all terminal elevators, the government proposed a clause divorcing storage from trading. It provided that no man who operated a terminal elevator should buy or sell grain.

Mr. Knowles submitted a final amendment to extend the prohibition to any "having an interest in the buying or selling of grain." It was rejected by the government.

This is already a government of broken promises," declared the Moosejaw man. It has broken its promise to the Proletariat of Ontario in connection with a uniform marriage act; it has broken its promise to the fishermen of the north; it has broken its promise to the depositors and shareholders of the Farmers Bank, whom it pledged itself to reorganize; it has broken its promise to the western farmers in connection with the control and operation of terminal elevators. But it kept its promise to the Manufacturers' Association and the highly protected interests in the establishment of a tariff commission.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier's final protest on the bill to create a tariff commission, however, resulted in the government "coming down" on the matter of parliament's right to the information gathered by the commission.

When the consideration of the measure was resumed tonight, Hon. Mr. White announced that the government was prepared to accept the Liberal amendment with a slight modification.

By this opposition triumph it is enacted that all reports from the tariff commission, excepting those which in their nature are of a confidential character, shall be submitted to parliament within fifteen days after the opening of the session, or if parliament be in session at the time of their receipt, within fifteen days after they reach the minister.

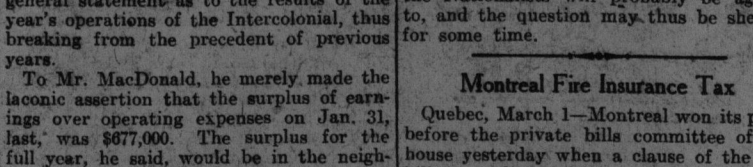
