ENGLISH CAPITAL IN AMERICA.

One Hundred Millions to be Invested in a Single Enterprise. BY TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. NEW YORK, Dec. 6.—The Times says that English capital to the extent of one hundred million dollars is about to be invested in this country in a single enterprise. It will be what is known as a "financing" company and its principal object is to provide credit for new American railroad property by a system of insurance mortgages and guarantees, and furnishing all necessary support for new railway enterprises.
