INJUSTICE TO ST. JOHN.

We copied the other day from the Sun the interesting particulars of an interview with a gentleman of this city and the captain of the H. M. S. Canada, which showed that the admiral's chart of St. John harbor had been amended so as to agree with the chart of the department of public works.

The alterations in the chart, although satisfactory as far as they go do not go far enough, and will not do justice to St. John until the sailing directions for the harbor of St. John, which were published in 1885 with some amendments in 1888.

The sailing directions are issued by the British Admiralty, are based on publications issued as early as 1850, and are, therefore, very out of date.

While they have been altered in some respects they have not been altered so as to give a correct idea of the Bay of Fundy or of the harbor of St. John. For instance, the beginning of the description of the Bay of Fundy is that the Bay of Fundy is deep, but the navigation is rendered not only difficult but dangerous.
