- Q.425 And that is the actual cost of repairs?
- A.425 That is the actual cost.
- Q.426 What basis do you use for the fixing those prices for parts?
- A.426 Through Parts Books, our Spare Parts Department have Parts Books from the different manufacturers listing these prices.
- Q.427 Are those the authorized prices to be charged?
- A.427 They are.
- Q.428 Mr. Webster, in the summary of evidence you estimated the cost of repairing the vehicle at \$84.35, what is the discrepancy there? Had the repairs been done at that time?
- A.428 When was this summary taken?
- Q.429 2nd of September, 1943?
- A.429 Second day of September. Oh! I would say that at the time that possibly they took delivery of the car on the night of the first of September. I don't know if the repairs would be completed at that time it was just a rough summary at that particular time.

PROSECUTOR: I would like to call to the Court's attention that the accused is only charged with the value of \$84.35 and the actual proof is greater than that amount.

PRESIDENT: On checking over the totals which you gave us, that is, at the beginning of your evidence, \$96.05 less a credit of 79¢ makes a total of \$95.26, whereas, your itemized figures make a total of \$95.58. Do you know what causes this difference of 32¢?

WITNESS: Yes, Sir, the 79¢ is less the 40%, if it was at 100% that amount would have been \$1.11.
