### LOSS OF TWO STEAMERS.

Owing to treacherous fogs that have been so prevelant of late, many wrecks have occurred around our coast. Early this week the Norwegian steamer O. K. Knudsen struck at Gull Island Point, near St. Vincent's. The crew of 32 were obliged to immediately leave the ship which began to sink rapidly. The men rowed about in the fog all night and at 6 a.m. landed at Peter's River. The Knudsen was bound from Sydney to Wabana with coal cargo and was afterwards going north to load pit props. The ship was owned in Nor-

way and was 3500 tons gross. The second wreck was that of the S.S. Banda, also from Sydney with a cargo of coal bound to Granville, France. The Banda stuck at Water-
