- Q. That is both Mr. Favel, who died and his widow are Treaty Indians?
- A. Yes, taking Treaty?
- Q. What improvements have they made on the place?
- A. There was no improvements at all, just a garden, potatoe field.
- Q. Did they build any house there or did they live in the house which was there?
- A. They moved off the old building and are putting up a new house near the road.
- Q. On the road? A. Yes, they are living on it.
- Q. What is that worth, that last house that they built?
- A. It could not be worth more than \$100.
- Q. Then the whole improvements would not be worth more than \$100?
- A. There is nothing, just a little fence and a garden that is all.
- Q. Did Prince make any improvements on the lot before he sold it?
- A. Oh, yes, he had some potatoe field.
- Q. Was there a house on it?
- A. Oh, there was a house at the time Prince had it.
- Q. Did he life in that house himself?
- A. Yes, before he sold it and after he sold it.
- Q. He was living in that house at the time of the transfer?
- A. Oh, yes.

## Mr. Heap-

- Q. Did he have any part of the lot gardened or fenced?
- A. Yes, there is some potatoe field.
- Q. Acre, half an acre?
- A. I think there must be more than an acre.
- Q. And he did that, he was farming that at the time of the transfer?
- A. Oh, yes.
