



SEAL TENDERS addressed to the

 next, for the merchantable timber on
 the Tsouahdie Indian Reserve No. 15 at
 Jervis Inlet in the New Westminster
 District of the Province of British
 Columbia.

Tenderers should state the amount
 of cash bonus they are prepared to
 pay in one sum over and above dues
 at the rate of \$1 per M.f.b.m. or \$1
 per cord, such dues being payable as
 the timber is cut.

An annual license will be granted to
 the successful tenderer for which a
 fee of \$50 and an annual ground rent
 of 5 cents per acre shall be paid.
 Eight years will be allowed for the
 removal of the timber under the regu-
 lations of the Department, and a
 sworn return of the timber cut each
 season shall be furnished by a quali-
 fied scaler.

An accepted cheque on any Canadian
 chartered bank for ten per cent. of the
 amount of bonus tendered should ac-
 company each tender, which, in the
 event of failure to carry out the un-
 dertaking shall be forfeited to the
 Department. The balance of bonus
 offered must be paid within thirty
 days from the date of notification of
 acceptance of tender.
