B., Feb. 4.— Henry Anderson, a well-known far-mer living at Kingsley, fifteen miles mer living at Kingsley, fifteen miles above the city, yesterday took his life by shooting himself with a rifle. The unfortunate man had been melancholy for some time past and being left alone for a few minutes he committed the deed which resulted in his death. For the past week Mr. Anderson had talked incessantly of ending his life, and on Wednesday last he attempted to drown himself in a large hogshead. Yesterday morning he was upstairs with his wife. The latter was called down for some household purpose by the daughter and dred.
