FOX INDUSTRY STILL DRAWS THE MONEY OF INVESTORS
More than One Hundred Thousand Dollars from St. John, in One Company—No trouble to Secure Capital for Fox Ranching Purposes.

The month of June is the time when the fox rancher usually peers into the den with anxious expectation. The pups are usually old enough to be gazed at without unduly exciting the female or the litter. There are, however, some pairs which do not litter until June, but the general rule is for the young to arrive between the middle of May and the end of April. Reports which have reached the Canada Fox Exchange from the ranches throughout the province show that the crop of 1914 will be an average one. There are some ranches which have had poor results, whilst others have had exceptionally good luck, so that conditions are to be well balanced. One fact to be noted is that companies which last year were unsuccessful have this year a "full house." For instance, a certain ranch near Charlottetown did not raise a single pup. This year it has twenty-nine on foot, and a big dividend, probably one hundred per cent., will be declared. Some of the companies which last year paid enormous dividends, will have only a fair crop this year. It seems that nature must strike a balance. Nearly all the ranches in the vicinity of Charlottetown report good results. In some sections of the country there has been quite a percentage loss, which was thought to be the result of the abnormally severe weather early in April.
"Demand Excellent"
The situation with regard to the demand for the foxes, which, after all, is the critical test of the industry, is excellent. There is a steady inquiry for all kinds of silver black foxes, particularly class "A" or pedigree foxes, which are ranch bred for some generations. The foreign investor is becoming critical in his selection, and wishes to know all the facts about the company before he puts in his money. There is also a good demand for the cheaper silver blacks, including the offspring of high grade best silver stock. Many ranches report excellent results from cross foxes purchased last year. In one ranch of four pairs, twelve pups have been raised, three of which are pure silver blacks. The dividends will range all the way from one hundred to eight hundred per cent. in certain companies, which have been extraordinarily successful in this regard.
The market is now practically bare of 1914 dividend paying stock. A few odd shares are sometimes offered by parties who find it necessary to realize in order to meet other obligations.
"More Money."
The 1915 companies are securing capital quite readily for their enterprises. Connections have been established in nearly all the larger centers, and there is a steady inflow of outside money. It has been estimated, conservatively, that upwards of \$6,000,000 will find its way into the industry of Prince Edward Island from abroad this year. One company is being floated in Boston with forty pairs, the entire output of one line of breeding. The money is coming in at the rate of \$12,000 a day. Every company, large and small, has its agency in some of the outside centers, and there seems no doubt but that the necessary money will be here by the first of September to take care of the crop of 1914.
New ranches are being constructed in all parts of the province. Among those which are going up, will be one with a capacity of one hundred pens, and another with forty pens, to be established near Charlottetown, which will shortly be the centre of the fox industry. Foxmen, once they make money, prefer to live in the city, and the ranches will have the advantage of fire protection, water works, electric light, and other facilities.
The tourist traffic will be considerable increased this year owing to the fox industry. It is understood that thousands of visitors will come from Boston alone. The Confederation Celebration week should bring a large number of people here, most of whom are interested in the fox industry, and

THE RESULTS OF ONE SEASON IN P. E. ISLAND FOX FARMING
A Statement concerning the products of the different Ranches so far this season—A First-class Showing for the whole Industry.
Charlottetown, June 18.—What it is rather early to give a very accurate forecast of the prospects of many of the ranches, there are a number which can be safely reported on, unless some unforeseen losses occur. The ranchers are scarcely out of the woods yet, but if the pups survive until the end of June, investors can estimate their dividends with almost absolute certainty.
Among the companies which have great expectations are the following: The "Carruthers," with ranch at Newport. This ranch as splendid results, and a good dividend is expected. The "Samson Silver Black Fox Co.", the ranch is located near Charlottetown. A dividend of over 100 per cent. is confidently expected. This ranch was built last year, and in its first breeding season for them, 18 pups arrived.
The Belmont, capitalised at \$50,000, will likely declare a large dividend. The ranch is near Charlottetown.
The "Barkers," a company with a ranch in the western part of the Island, declared a small dividend last year. This year there has been a decided improvement.
The "Charlottetown," is one of the extremely fortunate companies—it has had exceptional success. The stock is now listed at 150, a premium of 50 per cent.
The "Freeland," a western company will also make a good showing. Their stock is selling at a premium.
The "Murray Harbor" declared a dividend of 157 per cent. last year. This season, it will be probably over 100 per cent.
The "Peerless," last year declared the remarkable dividend of 900 per cent., paid in cash and additional stock. This year, the results though not as phenomenal, will be very satisfactory. Among others which may be mentioned are the "Provincial," whose stock is quoted at 125. The "Seal River," quoted at 150, and the Massachusetts, the "Young Park," with its ranch near Charlottetown, is another of the lucky ones. A member of one of the exchanges states that one of the stockholders turned down an offer of \$200 for each of his 100 shares.
The names of many other companies could be given, to show that fortune still smiles in the business, and reference will be made to them later, when the results are more definitely known. There are enough instances mentioned in one issue of the Standard, to indicate the profitable possibilities of the industry.
And still the fox industry flourishes. Of course this is primarily on account of the continuance of the demand for breeding purposes. An Island paper states that all the available options of 1914 pups are being rapidly snapped up. One company in the western part of the Island sold options on the entire stock for next spring, compris-
