The Quasco Queen, a three masted  
auxiliary schooner, was successfully  
launched yesterday morning at St.  
Martins, at 11.30 o'clock, daylight  
time. The launching was a success  
in every way, the vessel gliding into  
the water, without delay or mishap of  
any sort. Mrs. A. F. Bentley christen-  
ed the Quasco Queen. Tug G. K. King  
towed the vessel up the creek. Follow-  
ing the launching speeches were made  
by Premier Foster and Stanley E. El-  
kin, M. P.

The Quasco Queen is the second to  
be launched by the St. Martins Ship-  
building Company, the former schooner  
being the Solina K. Goldman. A  
large number witnessed the launching.  
The vessel was built by A. F. Bentley,  
and is owned by Mr. Bentley, Hon. W.  
E. Foster, and S. E. Elkin, M. P.

**OBITUARY**  
Mrs. Thomas B. Hanington.  
Mrs. Hanington, wife of Ex-Port-  
land, Thos. B. Hanington, a lady of  
kindly heart, died at the home of her  
daughter, Mrs. H. C. Wetmore, Dor-  
chester street, yesterday forenoon af-  
ter a gradual decline in health and at  
an advanced age. Her husband and  
all her children save one, as well as  
several grandchildren, were at the  
Westmore home when the end came.  
Mrs. Hanington is mourned by two  
sons, Frederic E. of this city, and Dr.  
Blais C. of Philadelphia, and four  
daughters, Mrs. Manning, wife of Dr.  
James Manning, of this city; Mrs.  
Wetmore, of Dorchester street, widow  
of Dr. H. C. Wetmore; Miss Gertrude  
M. Hanington, of Boston, and Mrs.  
Geo. A. Harper, of Winnipeg, who was  
unable to come to her mother's be-  
side.

Mrs. Hanington was Frances P. A.  
Tilley, a sister of the late Sir Samuel  
Leonard Tilley, of St. John, lieutenant-  
governor of New Brunswick at the  
time of his death, and one of the  
fathers of Confederation. Mrs. George  
Hanington, of Manchester, Mass., a sis-  
ter, is the remaining survivor of the  
illustrious Tilley family. She was  
present last year when Sir Leonard's  
centenary was observed with special  
ceremonies at the King Square brough  
memorial. Mrs. Hanington was too ill  
at that time to share in the public  
tribute.

All through her life Mrs. Hanington  
exhibited a sweetly benign attitude to-  
wards all who enjoyed her acquaint-  
ance. It was her special delight to be  
hostess to her friends and relatives  
and reunions of large proportions fre-  
quently enlivened the happy home. To  
be spared to a ripe age among her de-  
voted children and grandchildren is a  
privilege for which she was daily  
thankful for, as well as were the mem-  
bers of her family.

Had Mrs. Hanington been spared  
until the 23rd of next month, it was  
the family's intention to hold a six-  
tieth wedding anniversary for their par-  
ents.

Friday at 2.30 (daylight time) at St.  
John's (Stone) Church.  
Edward Hickman.
