German Ships Now Ready.
 Hamburg, Feb. 10.—The Frankfort Gazette announces that the German vessels which are to be turned over to the Entente for the purpose of transporting food supplies will be composed of nine steamships of the Hamburg-American line, and two ships each from the Orient Line, the Cosmo Line, the Germano-Austrian Navigation Society and the Hamburg and South American line. The newspaper adds that the sailings of the vessels have been delayed by the high wage demands of the seamen, but that this question will be settled at a new conference with the Allied representatives at Spa.

Greece Sea Loss Was \$200,000,000.
 Athens, Feb. 10.—The maritime losses of Greece during the war aggregated \$200,000,000, the Greek Foreign Minister has computed. Information to this effect has been sent by the Foreign Minister to Premier Venizelos, now attending the Paris Peace Conference as a delegate.

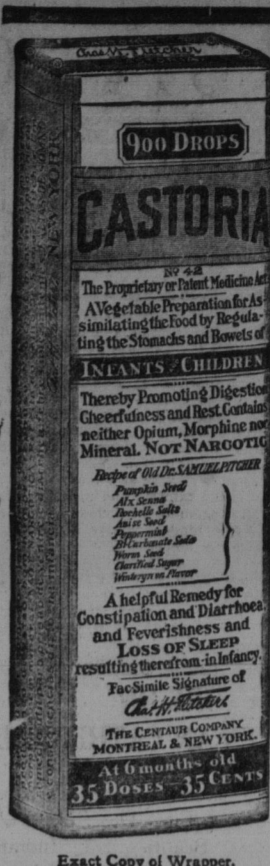
THE PLEBISCITE AT NEWCASTLE
 Citizens Approve of Council Applying to Legislature for \$150,000 Bonds for Development of Water Power.

Newcastle, Feb. 11.—The plebiscite held today as to the advisability of the town council applying to the Provincial Legislature for authority to issue one hundred and fifty thousand dollar bonds to develop water power on Zvege River, carried ten to one, the vote being 128 for and twelve against.

Three ballots were spotted; total vote 143. The registered voters numbered about eight hundred, and of these fully four hundred had their taxes paid, and were qualified to vote.
