PROPOSED STREET EXTENSIONS AND OPENINGS ON CITY PLAN

Ontario Railway and Municipal Board Will Consider Same at Sitting Here Next Month

As has been officially announced the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board will hold a sitting in this city on Wednesday, May 7th. Among matters to be considered is the new city plan that has been made by the City Planning Commission through the services of City Engineer B. Michel. The purpose of the Railway Board is to look over the situation and hear the opinions of the Commission and the citizens.

Another matter will be the application of the City Council to change the ward boundaries of the city. Regarding the new City plan the planning commission since its inception about two years ago have dealt not only with several plans of streets and street openings that were presented to them but has also made recommendations for improvements which they consider should be made sooner or later. This includes the widening and extension of one street in the centre of the city; the extension of short dead ends of streets; the linking up of unconnected streets and so forth. By the Town Planning act it is provided that a Commission or a Council if there is no planning Commission may have such a plan drawn up and submitted to the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board for ratification, which will then hear the views of all interested persons and the various municipalities in the five mile radius of the major municipality; in this case Waterloo, the police village of Bridgeport and the Township of Waterloo are interested and accordingly they have been notified.

Under the present act the initiative for carrying out any of the improvements on the plan will still rest with the City Council. The working out of the Statutes at present means a check at both ends in the laying out of streets or subdivisions. The City Council must have the approval of the Commission wherever they wish to carry into effect a plan for opening a street or extending one. On the other hand if the Commission want an improvement made the proceedings of actually having it carried out is in the hands of the Council only.

The ratification of the plan, however, by the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board, even if it is not carried out immediately is considered as having an advantage. It is like a notification or warning sign. With the plan adopted it puts the city on record as looking ahead to carry out these improvements, sooner or later; it is calculated to call for a public spirit on the part of the public and individuals who may be affected.

If a plan is adopted now after all opinion has been heard, it is pointed out that say even ten years hence, the proceedings to carry any of them out will be easier. The various improvements suggested by the Commission are as follows, which will be considered by the Railway Board on May 7th: Duke Street produced from Queen to Frederick St. and widened its whole length.

Margaret Avenue produced from Queen to Otto St., 40 ft. wide. Mansion Street produced from Elgin to Ahrens St. Hohner Avenue produced from Lancaster to Irvin St., across lower end of School grounds. Eby and Brubacher Street produced to meet. Elgin St. produced Pandora to Stirling Ave. and from Stirling across Monument Cemetery, along its easterly boundary, to East Avenue, (new). East Avenue, (new), from King St. opposite South St. across Frederick

and Mansion Sts., along La Grange and across G. T. K., by overhead bridge, to Spring St.

Spring Street produced easterly to River St.

Blucher Boulevard produced easterly to Lancaster St. and westerly across G. T. R. by overhead bridge to Waterloo St.

Guelph Street produced westerly Margaret Ave. to Brunswick Ave. joining Schulte St.

St. Ledger Street produced to Bridgeport-Waterloo Road.

Mutual Avenue, (new), from Devitt St., Waterloo, opposite end of T. H. St., easterly to Lancaster St. and Margaret Ave. and St. Ledger St. produced.

New street across Mount Hope Cemetery from Pels Ave. to King St.

Pels Avenue produced easterly to Waterloo St.

Boulevard from Queen to Albert St., along south limit of Woodside Park, etc.

Cameron Street produced southerly to Courtland Ave.

Devonshire Street, (new), from Henry to Theresa, and Turk Street, produced to Devonshire St.

Regarding the widening of streets it might be stated that this was other improvements rests with the Council, who have the power to proceed if they do so desire. Arbitration, however, is provided for by statute in case the residents of the street, cannot agree.
