LIBERAL MOTIONS RE: RECIPROCITY

1930 - 35

1. Motion of Mr. Duff, H. of C. Debates, Feb. 20, 1933:

"That, in the opinion of this House, it is expedient that the Government of Canada re-open negotiations with the Government of the United States of America with a view of bringing about a satisfactory reciprocal trade arrangement between Canada and the United States whereby the natural products of Canada, that is the products of the sea, the farm, the mines, and the forests, and including fish, lumber, wheat, cattle, etc., should have free entry into the United States in exchange for the admission of certain goods from the United States of America, which in the interests of both countries may be admitted into Canada, free from customs tariffs."

2. Second Motion of Mr. Duff, H. of C. Debates, Feb. 19, 1934:

Mr. Duff reintroduced his Motion of the previous year, to which Mr. Bennett moved an Amendment reaffirming the joint statement of President Roosevelt and himself made at Washington, April 30th, 1933; Mr. Bennett added "While no trade agreement between the two countries has yet been arrived at, this House approves of the Government continuing their efforts to that end."
