1. Mottom of Mr. Duff, N. of C. Debates, Neb. 20, 1935:

pedient that the Covernment of Canada re-open negotiations with the Covernment of the United States of America with a view of bringing about a satisfactory reciprocal trade arrangement between Canada and the United States whereby the natural products of Canada, that is the products of the sea, the ferm, the mines, and the forests, and including fish, lumber, wheat, cattle, etc., should have free entry into the United States in exchange for the adminishment of certain goods from the United States of America, which in the interests of both countries may be admitted into Canada, free from customs tariffe."

2. Second Motion of Mr. Duff. H. of C. Debutes, Veb. 19,1984:

Mr. Buff reintroduced his Motion of the previous year, to which Mr. Heunett moved an Amendment reaffirming the joint statement of President Roosevelt and himself made at Mashington, April 30th, 1935; Mr. Bennett added "While no trade agreement between the two countries has yet been arrived at, this House approves of the Government continuing their efforts to that end."
