

**SIEVERT, JULIUS G.**

Born October 4th, 1879, at Halifax, N. S. Son of Julius G. Sievert. Served in the 66th Regiment. Served in South Africa in 2nd R. C. R. Was wounded in the abdomen at Paardeberg during the early morning advance on Cronje's laagar of February 27th, 1900 (Majuba Day), and died at Klipdrift on the 1st of March, 1900, from the effects of the wound. He was wounded while endeavoring to drag back to our trenches the body of his comrade, George Orman.

**WEBSTER, L. BEVERLEY BARCLAY.**

Born 15th September, 1878, at Kentville, N. S. Son of Barclay Webster, Esq. Was Lieutenant King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment. Died in London on the 22nd of March, 1902, of rheumatism and heart failure, brought on by exposure during the South African war. Buried at Kentville, N. S.

**WILLISTON, HARRY B.**

Born November 28th, 1880, at Acadia Mines, N. S. Son of Charles Williston. Served in South Africa as a Corporal in the Canadian Scouts. Died February 9th, 1902, at Pretoria of wounds received in action 14 days previously. Buried at Pretoria.
