JANUARY.—We have occasionally, in former years, referred to the subject of manufes, and have given advice respecting them. The celebrated agriculturist, J. G. Mechi, has proved that the common nuisances of a barnyard dungheap is unnecessary. He says the bulk of manure made by his animals is taken from under them, and at once applied to the soil, and that the resulting crops give unmistakeable evidence of the correctness of this practice. He cuts up his straw (by steam power) into two-inch lengths. The cut straw is applied as litter from day to day, care being taken not to use more than will get thoroughly saturated and intermixed with the solid manure,—in fact, enough to keep the animals clean. Trodden into a sort of a hodge-podge, it will excel the best guano ever used in the production of crops, and in the matter of profit.
