ECLIPSES.

1.- A partial eclipse of the Moon, April 21-22; invisible in Canada.

II .- A total Eclipse of the Sun, May 6; invisible in Canada,

III .- A partial Eclipse of the Moon, October 15; invisible in Canada.

IV.—An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, October 30; visible in the eastern portion of the continen of North America.

Phases of the Moon.

In the calculation of the Phases of the Moon or the Moon's changes, 5 hours 17 minutes have been deducted from the Greenwich time for Toronto; 4 hours 54 minutes for Montreal; and 3 hours 51 minutes for Halifax.
