THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 5g, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood tot for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of such that of the area, more or less than of 168 area, more or less.

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commission of the interior, Wimipeg, or the Local Agent for the direction, Wimipeg, or the Local Agent for the direction of the land of the land of the authority for name of the land of the land of the A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father for mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions, that Act, resides upon a farm in the ricinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner prescribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by second homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead;

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provision⁸ of Chauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stockwith buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 39 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must gives ix months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION
