

SOME COWS THAT ARE FACTORS IN THE WONDERFUL ADVANCEMENT OF CANADIAN DAIRYING
Cows such as would gladden the heart of any dairyman are those owned by Mr. J. K. Moore and Son, of Peterborough Co., Ont., whose farm is entered in Farm and Dairy's Prize Farms Competition. They are all high grade Holsteins. During June their 24 cows gave a factory return of 31,000 lbs., or over 1,000 lbs. a day. The six best cows in the same period gave 1,770, 1,630, 1,600, 1,590, 1,580 and 1,540 lbs. of milk respectively. The best cow gave 13,000 lbs. in a year, while the herd average last year was over 8,500 lbs. These results are the reward of good feed, pure bred sires, careful selection, and knowing that each cow paid her way. They are well within the reach of all dairymen.
