

The Workmen's Compensation Act of Canada.

This law which has become in force on the first day of January 1910, provides for an indemnity and compensation for injuries to workmen for accidents suffered by them in the course of their work.

It is taken partly from the English Act and from the French law. The author gives the text of the law and under each article cites the French and English Jurisprudence.

Appendix A contains the French law of the 9th of April 1898, with the amendments of 1899, 1906 and 1907.

Appendix B contains the English's consolidation of the Workmen's compensation Act of 1906.

Appendix C is a compound discount table for computing the period during which any given capital sum will continue to yield a certain annual rent at various rates of compound interest.

Appendix D shows the duration of an annual rent from \$100.00 to \$100.00 to be derived from a capital of \$500.00 to \$2,000.00 at the rate of 3 per cent., the basis used by insurance companies generally.

And the book has an ample and well made index.

This is a very useful book, both for theory and practice.

The author, who is already well known by his Code of Civil Procedure, has conferred a great help to the legal profession and to the community in general in given them, in a so short time, the text, the doctrine and the jurisprudence on these difficult and of every day occurrence cases.
