BRANDON, MAN.—The School Board have decided in favor of submitting a by-law to the ratepayers to borrow \$80,000 for the following purposes: New Collegiate Institute, \$40,000; eight-roomed school in Ward 5, \$25,000; two-roomed school north of C.P.R. tracks, \$5,000; repairs to Central school, \$5,000; unpaid balance, \$5,000.—The Brandon Creamery Company will build a new plant on Rosser avenue, the work of construction to be commenced early in the spring.

MONTREAL, QUE.—The Kemp Manufacturing Company, Toronto, have purchased a site on St. Antoine street on which to build a large warehouse.—The plans of Saxe & Archibald, architects, have been accepted for the new Emmanuel Congregational church to be erected on Drummond street, near Sherbrooke. It will be built of grey brick with sandstone trimmings, cost about \$80,000. Ground will be broken May 1st.—A large wholesale dry goods firm is said to have purchased the property immediately east of the premises of Greenshields, Limited, on Craig street, the intention being to build a large block.

OTTAWA, ONT.—The Waterworks Committee have decided to make application to the Legislature for authority to raise by debentures \$100,000 for waterworks construction and extension.—Ald. Pepper, Chairman Waterworks Committee, will receive tenders until Feb. 27th for supply of castings, brasswork, piping, etc., for the current year.—James Davidson, Chairman Board of Works, will receive tenders up to Feb. 28 for annual supply of broken stone, curbing, plank and cedar, brick, hardware, sand, tile pipe and Portland cement.—Bishop Horner intends building an addition to the College of the Holiness Movement, Bank street.—J. K. Paisley, proprietor of the Grand Union Hotel, has concluded

the purchase of property on E'gin street, between Waverley and Frank streets, and has in view the erection of a modern apartment building.

HAMILTON, ONT.—Klein & Birkley wish to secure a long lease of the site on James street, north of the City Hall, on which they propose to erect a six-storey office building.—A new stable will be built in connection with No. 3 police station.—Stewart & Witton, architects, have received instructions to prepare plans for the following buildings: A \$5,000 brick house, Bay and Duke streets, for Dr. A. Woolverton; a \$3,000 house on Farleigh avenue for A. Taliman; three houses, corner Wellington and Evans streets, for Joseph Farmer. Same architects are preparing plans for an extensive remodelling of St. Andrews'




