bring their wheat forward ; the demand is limited to the requirements of local mills. It is doubtful even if prices were better that any quantity would be moved, so long as the barley lasts, and is as eagerly sought for and saleable at such long prices as at present. Speculators will not take hold of breadstuffs until they are satisfied that they have breadstuns until they are satisfied that they have touched bottom, which, notwithstanding the greatly reduced prices reached, is still uncertain. It is thought by many that the favorable crops have had an undue influence on prices; that the general anticipation of a decline has led to a much more rapid movement of wheat to market than is usual; that the increased receipts so induced have tended to the belief that the yield was greater than it will shortly prove to be, and that thensay in the latter part of October or in Novemberwill come a reaction. Be this as it may, no one buys just now except on orders or for immediate use, the chances being considered on the side of still-lower prices. Spring has settled down to \$1.15 and \$1.18; midge-proof is worth \$1.20. Barley .- Receipts for the week by rail 38, 000 bush. against 41,058 bush. dast week ; receipts by teams 130,000 bush. and 120,000 bush. for the previous week. This day week the market opened at \$1.10 to \$1.12, and gradually advanced to \$1.20 and \$1.21, on the street; but owing to a break in Oswego, fell off to the opening prices of the week ; within the last two days an improvement has taken place; the market closing at the quotations in our price list. The total receipt of barley from all sources are estimated at nearly 600,000 bush. and the shipments at 350,000 to 400,000 bush.
