We receive with the most lively Satisfaction your Excellency's Congratulations on the repeated Succeffes of his Majesty's Arms, and the recent Victories of his Allies. Glorying in our Connection with our parent Country, and deeply interested in her Prosperity, every Instance of her Triumphs over the Foe gives us the highest Gratification, and while we contemplate with Pleasure the Advantages gained by his Majesty's Allies, we acknowledge with Admiration and Gratitude the Wisdom and found Policy of our most Gracious Sovereign, which have raised, and now support the Confederacy against the baneful Disturbers of the Peace of Europe and common Enemies of Mankind; on the Continuance of this Policy we rely (under Heaven) for the Restoration of Peace and the Preservation of Religion, Government, and the Blessings of civil Society on Earth.
