

As a very large majority, 19 (92 against 73) had been cast against the resolution when the voters had separated themselves into two separate rooms, and as this majority was corverted into a minority of 4 (70 against-66) by the poll, we believe that the resolution was carried by the confusion brought about in the minds of a number of voters who did not thoroughly understand the nature of the vote they were recording. As it would only require a change of three votes from one column to another to reverse the decision of the poll, and as the proceedings were not carried on for the voting and recording of immediately preceding the time and the poll as the law requires, we respectfully request that you will set aside the proceedings at this poll as being irregular and not in substantial accordance with the instructions given in the Act, and that you will order a new poll to be taken in a manner which will prevent all irregularities and any interference with the voter while he gives his vote, except as provided for by the Act.


