or a strenuous six months  
spent in the trenches. He has  
been in hospital ever since. He  
has a 14 days furlough and will  
then go to Halifax, and later  
to Toronto to get an artificial  
limb. He lost one leg in his  
last battle, it being amputated  
just below the knee. He is feel-  
ing well and can move around  
nicely with his crutches. His  
relatives and many friends glad-  
ly welcome him home after do-  
ing his part in the Empire's de-  
fence.

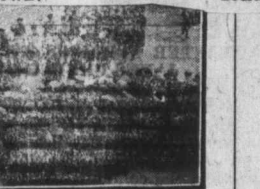
