BUFFALO FANS ANXIOUS TO SEE FLEMING

Buffalo, N. Y., April 12.—In casting about for a suitable opponent for Elmer Doane, the Buffalo featherweight who has graduated into a light weight of pretension, the Queensberry Athletic Club is inclining towards Frankie Fleming, the Canadian champion. And if a match can be made bringing the Dominion star together with the local favorite, it will mean a bout worth while.

Fleming has never tried his luck in a Buffalo ring, but more than one of the local camp during the last few years has crossed into the Dominion to meet him and returned a sadder

Aside from local victories Fleming has proved himself against the best which the United States has sent against him, both in Canada and in the American boxing centers and a meeting with him would be a terrific test for the east sider.

Knocked Leonard Out Twice. Fleming has always been a great boxer, even from the days when he was just entering the featherweight ranks, several years ago, and before he had taken on the poundage that is sending him against the lightweights these days. No other than Benny Leonard, the present lightweight champion, would probably be just as well pleased if Fleming had never entered pugilism. Two bad blotches on the Leonard record were put there by Fleming, who, in 1912, knocked out Freddy Welsh's conqueror in seven rounds and two years after, 1914, when the Harlemitte was getting dangerous, Frankie repeated the trick in five rounds. Thereafter Leonard permitted Fleming to roam in peace.

Strong as Doane is going today it may be that he can do better against the Canadian star than his predecessors from this city, but no matter which scored the victory it would be a sizzling glove contest.

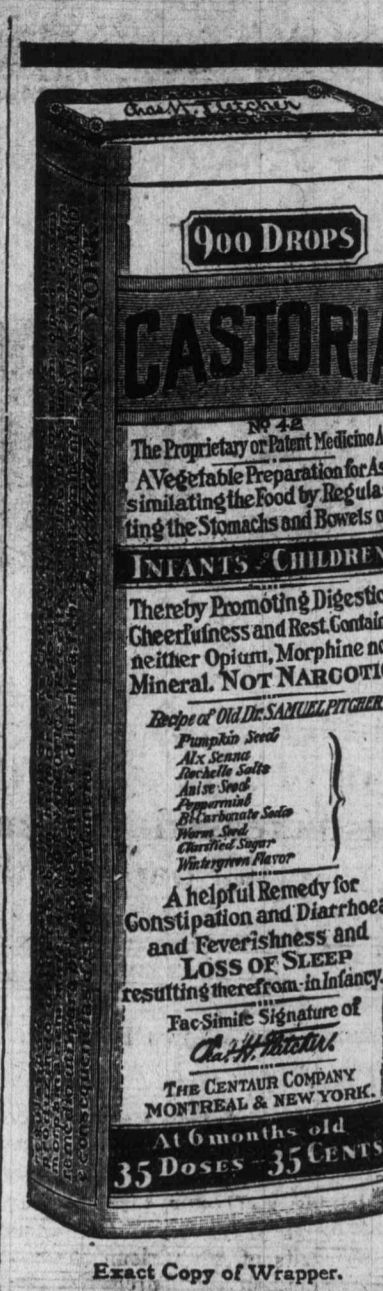
