#### A Wonderful Experiment.

Kept Vital Organs Alive for Ten Hours After Removal from Body.

New York, Oct. 26.-Another ster forward in Dr. Alexis Carrell's experiments looking to the prolongation o life is announced at the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research. Some time ago Dr. Carroll creaed a sensation in the scientific world by keeping a fragment of tissue from a chicken heart, "alive" for 104 days.

Now he has succeeded in separating from the body of an animal the eart, stomacn, hver, intestines, kidney and bladder and in having these organs live and functionate under his eyes for ten hours.

To accomplish this result, the excised organs were placed in a solution, supplied wth blood aerated continuously by oxygen pumps and kept at the requisite temperature by an apparatus much like an incubator.

The aim of Dr. Carrell's experints was thus expounded by him in a recent address: "If it were possible transplant immediately after death the tissues and organs which compose the body into other dentical organisms. no elemental death would occur and all the constitutent parts of the body

ould continue to live."

Special Evening Telegram, LONDON, To-day, The prospect that a considerable ortion of the defeated Turkish Army will be able to reform behind the lines of Tchatalii, the last forth cations before Constantinople, is not altogether excluded, but whether the Turks will be able to maintain a serious resistance to the Bulgarian advance is a question which permits of doubt. In the struggle the Turks have lost more than half of their artillery. The Servians alone claim to have captured no less than 300 guns. This will certainly militate against any prolonged stand at Tch-atalja. In a circular note to Turk-ish Ambassadors abroad the Govern-ment maintains although embarrassed the position of affairs is not desperate. It declared when the allies had completed mobilization Turkey had barely begun hers. The note insists that Turkey is still able to maintain a prolonged warfare. Up to the present there is no sign of any outcome to the Porte's appeal to the Powers for mediation. No re-plies have been received. They will mbody a refusal to consider the dea of proposing an armistice. Apparently Bulgaria is in no mood to nego-tiate for peace at the present time. on the Tcholu Serai line correspond-Tchorluserai line correspondents are sending reports of garian and Turkish successes in that neighbourhood according to which side they draw inspiration from. Of-icial announcements from Constantinople that the Turks are with-lrawing to the Tchatalja line forts re not to be doubted, and it is evi-

ent that this fighting is an extensive rear guard action to cover the move-ment of the Turks toward Constantinople. The fall of Adrainople is ex-occted daily. The occupation of Buk, on the railway between Salonika, Kuleli and Burgas is the last ink of a chain wholly cutting off the Turkish armies which have fighting great battles in the East from scattered forces in the heart of the country and to the West. I considered not unlikely that fear of serious outbreaks in Constanti-nople may influence the Powers to use Diplomatic pressure to bring

about peace at the earliest moment.
