Opereita "Flowerland" at Bay Bulls.

Bay Bulls on Monday and Tuesday. The Opereita "Flowerland" was staged by the pupils of the St. Mary's Schools and was a success. The spacious hall was filled to its utmost capacity on both occasions and spectators were amply repaid for attending. The scenes are laid in the grounds of "Flowerland" (formerly an old English estate, now a College for Lady Gardeners) and centre around Barbara, a poor orphan and student from far off New Zealand, who has been sent there by her uncle to learn the horticultural art. Upon arrival she is taken in

hand by Madge (a fellow student) who becomes her friend, and to whom she confides that she is betrothed to a young Englishman who had left home on account of a quarrel with his elder brother, who was titled and had large estates in England. The Fairy Queen appears to Barbara and tells her she has something important to communicate and to meet her on the lawn that

night. Barbara does as directed and learns that "Flowerland" is the estate of which her betrothed spoke, that the elder brother had since died, and he was now the heir and pointed out the spot where the title deeds were hidden. In the meantime Miss McStringer (the Principal of the College) appears on the scene and Barbara is sent to bed in disgrace. The climax comes the following morning. Barbara's story is borne out when the deeds are found, explanations made and—closing chorus. Misses Bertha O'Brien and Anna Hearn as Barbara and Madge respectively are quite at home in their roles and give splendid portrayals. Miss Mary Williams as Miss McStringer the Principal of the College typifies the stately spinster to perfection. The comedy part is looked after by Miss Katie Faber, who impersonates Mrs. Treacle (an old village woman who steals sweetstuffs to students) with a professional touch. She keeps the audience on good terms with themselves. Miss Dorothy Hearn makes a very graceful little Fairy Queen. The various solos and choruses were well rendered and seldom is such dancing seen in a performance of this nature. The dancing of Miss Mary Stone, Dorothy Hearn and Loretto Carew deserves special mention. The following comprised the various choruses and dances:—

The following specialties between the acts added greatly to the enjoyment of the evening, doing away with that tiresome waiting which is very much in evidence in most places, even in St. John's. There was something doing from the first bell to the strains of the National Anthem.

Song—"My Dog Jack," Master James Whelan. Dance—"Highland Fling," Miss Loretto Carew. Duet—"Has Sorrow thy Young Days Shaded," Miss Lucy Gatherall and Mary Stone. Dance—Miss Ivy Williams, Katherine Hearn, Marie Maloney, Genevieve O'Driscoll. Dance—Miss Mary Stone. Misses Ryan and Green acted as accompanists, greatly helping to make the entertainment a success. The scenery was specially painted by Mr. J. P. Duffy of St. John's and was a credit to his skill with the brush. The costumes were gorgeous. The staging of the performance reflects the greatest credit on all concerned and is a revelation of what can be accomplished by school children under proper guidance. Rarely has it been the privilege of the writer to witness a performance of this description so well produced, the slightest detail not being overlooked. I have sometimes seen as good in St. John's, never outside. The Opereita was under the direction of Rev. Mother Winifred, whose reputation as a musician causes no wonder at the success of the undertaking. Rev. P. J. O'Brien and M. J. Kennedy, also several visitors from St. John's were present on Monday night—Com.
